

Little Theatre presents Monty Python's Spamalot

Little Theatre of Fall River closes its main-stage season with *Spamalot*, a Tony Award-winning musical spoof based on the classic film comedy, *Monty Python and the Holy Grail*. Performances are at Bristol Community College's Jackson Arts Auditorium from May 15th to the 18th.

With book and lyrics by Eric Idle and a new score by Eric Idle and John Du Prez, *Spamalot* is set in England in the year 932 A.D. and tells the tale of King Arthur and his knights. Frustrated by several failed recruitment attempts for his round table, Arthur searches the land and finally comes up with Sir Bedevere, the Strangely Flatulent; Sir Lancelot the Brave; Sir Dennis Galahad, the Dashingly Handsome - previously known as just Dennis Galahad; Sir Robin, the not-quite-so-brave-as Sir-Lancelot; and others as they search for the Holy Grail. Thus, the fun begins.

According to director Robbie Burke, "I always loved Monty Python and wanted to do it the first time I saw it. I just love the clever hilarity and brilliant nonsense. The message it leaves with me, and hopefully with the audience would be 'Always look on the bright side of life'!!!!"

Starring in *Spamalot* are Jay Burke as Arthur; John Ashley as Sir Robin; Ryan Durkay as Sir Lancelot; Stephen Nowell, Jr. as Sir Galahad; Nishan Ian Lawton as Patsy; Tracy Gendreau as The Lady of the Lake; and Robin Richard as Sir Bedevere. The directors are Robbie Morgan Burke and Roberto S. C. Soares; musical director is Alex Tirrell; choreographer is Jen Bellanti; and stage managers are Beverly Robinson and Kerie A. Collins
